SCHOLARSHIPS FOR OUT-OF-STATE FINE ART STUDENTS

What is the value of this award? The amount of the award is equal to the out-of-state portion of tuition and fees. The net result is that you will pay the same fees as an in-state student. As of the 2007-2008 academic year (based on a 15 credit hour semester) the award is worth \$6,690 each semester. It is renewable for up to eight semesters.

What do I have to do in return?

- Be a full-time student (minimum of 15 credit hours).
- Maintain satisfactory academic standing (a 2.0 GPA).
- The student **MUST** take at least one art studio class every semester in order to meet the requirement of “performance”, **AND** be continuously enrolled as a Fine Art Major: Bachelor’s of Art (BA) or Bachelor’s of Fine Art (BFA).
- Update your contact information (mailing address, phone number, email) with your PPS Coordinator at the end of **EVERY** semester. This can be done with a phone call or an email.

In order to retain this Scholarship you **MUST** meet the requirements listed above **EVERY SEMESTER**. If you fail to meet anyone of these requirements you will loose the Public Performance Scholarship. Once a student looses this scholarship, it cannot be reinstated. If for any reason you foresee not being able to meet these requirements, contact the PPS Coordinator immediately.

Who is Eligible? The Public Performance Scholarship is available only to students that have been accepted to ETSU and whose legal residency is out-of-state. Students who reside in Scott, Lee, and Washington counties in Virginia and Avery, Watauga, Mitchell, Madison, and Yancey counties in North Carolina are eligible for in-state tuition and therefore are **NOT** eligible for a PPS. Additionally, the PPS is only available to incoming first semester freshman, or first semester transfer students. Students who are already attending ETSU are not eligible.

Am I still eligible for other scholarships as well? Yes. You may accept other ETSU scholarships as long as the total does not exceed the full amount of your costs for the semester. Scholarships from sources outside ETSU are not affected in any way. Your financial aid package may, however, be adjusted to reflect scholarship amounts.

To Apply for this Scholarship: Submit a completed application form and a portfolio that contains 15 recent artworks to the PPS Coordinator. **The DEADLINE is April 1 of each Spring Semester.** **Note: Scholarships for Fall 2009 are still available and applications will be accepted.**
