

Digital media students to hold 'Experiments in Digital Art' exhibition

Students in the ETSU digital media program will hold an exhibition of their work and a reception on Tuesday, May 5, from 5-7 p.m. in the Scott M. Niswonger Digital Media Center located across State of Franklin Road from the main campus.

The artists are students in the "Advanced Raster-Based Imaging" class taught by Cher Cornett, associate professor in the ETSU digital media program. The class involves experimentation in photographic imaging and retouching techniques, digital painting, video rotoscoping, and motion graphics as well as lenticular prints — the type that change from one image to another as the viewer moves.

During this semester, students were also required to write and present the stories behind their creations and enter one of several SIGGRAPH juried competitions in digital print, animation, and interactive media.

SIGGRAPH is a California-based organization "dedicated to the generation and dissemination of information on computer graphics and interactive techniques."
