



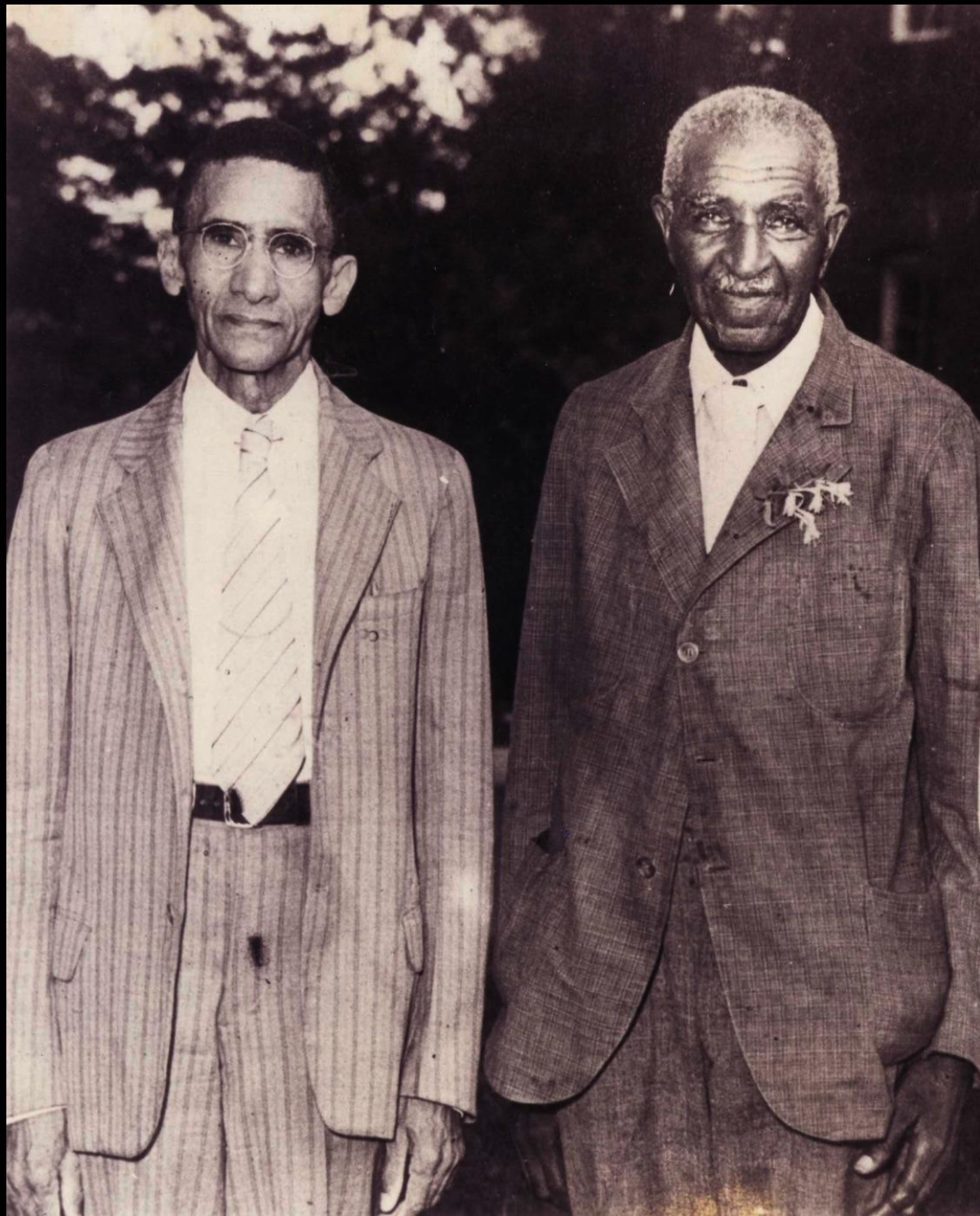

the son of a former slave in 1872, Isaac Scott Hathaway became an amazing and influential artist. He is best known for sculpting busts and portraits of prominent African American individuals including Frederick Douglas, Booker T. Washington, and George Washington Carver. Hathaway also designed the first U.S. coin to feature an African American.
