APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION TO TEACHER EDUCATION**

**YOU MUST FOLLOW THE DIRECTIONS NOTED BELOW OR YOUR APPLICATION
WILL NOT BE PROCESSED**

You MUST have a file established in the College of Education, Student Advisement Office or you will not be eligible to submit a board application.

The following items must be included with your board application AND must be delivered to the College of Education, Student Advisement Office, Warf Pickel Room 321 by the deadline date:

- 1. Official evidence of attained required scores on all portions of the PPST or required score on the ACT or SAT.**
 - **If you need evidence of your ACT or SAT score AND it is noted on your student academic account through ETSU, we can print that off for you. If your scores are not noted on your account, you may obtain evidence of those scores through the high school from which you graduated.**
 - **You MUST verify through ETS how you will receive evidence of PRAXIS I scores. It is best that you request to have a copy of your scores be mailed directly to you. Although you may request a copy to be sent to ETSU, College of Education, it can take up to six weeks for us to receive them. Therefore, you may bring the form you receive by mail to Warf Pickel, Room 321, and we will make a copy to add to your application.**

- 2. Transcript**
 - **A transcript may be printed from your Goldlink account, but MUST be printed in our office. We will not accept a transcript from Goldlink that has been printed outside Warf Pickel, Room 321.**
 - **If you choose to request an “issued to student” transcript from the Registrar’s Office, it MUST be requested a week prior to the application deadline date and MUST be added to your board application. DO NOT REQUEST A TRANSCRIPT TO BE SENT TO THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION.**

- 3. Program of Study (check sheet) with all grades listed. (Be sure to document approved substitutions for listed courses.)**

- 4. Signed and notarized statement of Good Moral Character.**

5. Meet passing scores on a speech and hearing test. (Sign up for a test in Room 321 Warf-Pickel. Tests given Fall and Spring semesters only.)
6. **YOU MUST BRING YOUR PORTFOLIO TO YOUR INTERVIEW. INTERVIEWS ARE SCHEDULED THROUGH THE PROGRAMS.**

(Effective Fall 2008) All Students must complete a background check and receive clearance. This MUST be completed at least **four weeks prior to submitting your application to Teacher Education. You MUST follow the College of Education guidelines for your Background Check. Ask for guidelines in Room 321 Warf-Pickel. Once completed, the background check results will come to our office and we will add it to your board application. Background checks that are over a year old at the time of the board application deadline date will NOT be accepted.**

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

Completed applications will be forwarded to the Board interview coordinators specific to students' licensure areas. Coordinators will contact students to schedule interviews. Admissions Boards will be comprised of one or more faculty from interviewing departments, a public school teacher, and other individuals as deemed appropriate. Admissions Boards will review students' applications prior to the formal interviews. Questions asked during the interviews will be developed to ascertain students' general knowledge, ability to communicate, and potential for success in the teaching profession; the interview is not a course examination. Admissions Boards will determine if students meet admissions criteria. A Professional Advisor will notify students by mail of admissions decisions. If admission is denied, applicants may follow the established appeals process.
