

## **INFECTION CONTROL/HAZARDOUS MATERIAL TRAINING FOR NURSING MAJORS**

All nursing majors must complete training on infection control, bloodborne pathogens and hazardous materials. Education and testing on these topics will be provided during class sessions in the first semester health Assessment class of the major for BSN students. After the initial in-class training, BSN students must complete an annual update with testing and provide documentation of test results to the Office of Student Services in order to continue in clinical courses. RN-BSN, MSN and PhD students will not have in-class instruction, but will do both initial and annual online instruction and testing.

1. Nursing majors in all programs must complete the College of Nursing on-line training and testing.
2. Agencies used for clinical experiences may require additional training.
3. Documentation of training must be turned in to the College of Nursing Office of Student Services (OSS). Faculty will provide to OSS documentation of the initial in-class training for BSN students. Students are responsible for providing timely documentation of online updates and testing. Students who do not complete training and document the training to Student Services will not be permitted to participate in clinical experiences.
4. Students are encouraged to bring questions about infection control to class or clinical instructors.

### **HOW CAN STUDENTS OBTAIN AND DOCUMENT TRAINING?**

2. Click on **Current Student** and then **Clinical Requirements – HIPPA and Infection Control**.
3. Study the online Power Point presentation on Infection Control and Hazardous Materials.
4. At the end of the presentation, go to the D2L site: <https://elearn.etsu.edu/>, click on the Administrative link for CON Office of Student Services, then click on Assessments and take the OSHA Post-Training Quiz.
5. You must score 85% to pass the test. If your score is less than 85%, you will be notified by email that you must re-take the test to remain eligible for clinical experiences.
