

OTHER WAYS TO MEET DEFICIENCIES

DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATIONS

Eligible students may establish advanced standing through approved examination programs and educational experiences. Comprehensive departmental examinations are available in the college level courses listed inside. Consult the Undergraduate Bulletin, Academic Regulations section, under Advanced Standing for more information. There are no departmental exams for the English, Algebra, and Advanced Math/Geometry areas.

EAST TENNESSEE STATE UNIVERSITY MEETING HIGH SCHOOL UNIT DEFICIENCIES

GENERAL INFORMATION

The completion of certain high school units as an admission requirement for Tennessee Board of Regents (TBR) universities began in the Fall of 1989.

The Visual/Performing Arts requirement began in the Fall of 1993. Information can be secured from the Office of Admissions. These requirements affect new freshmen and transfer students.

Upon initial enrollment at ETSU, applicants meeting the following criteria may not need to remove deficient units.

ADMISSION STATUS -- HIGH SCHOOL UNIT REQUIREMENTS

First-time freshmen and transfer students will be notified of any deficiencies by letter. Students admitted to the university who are required to complete unit deficiencies will receive information about registration for the appropriate term. Once students register for classes, their progress toward meeting these deficiencies will be monitored by the Office of the Registrar.

TIME FRAME

Students will be required to take the necessary courses for meeting their high school unit deficiencies prior to reaching junior standing (60 credit hours earned). However, students are **strongly encouraged** to take the necessary course(s) to remove deficiencies **during their first year**.

GRADE REQUIREMENTS

Students must earn a grade of "C" or better in all college level courses taken to remove unit deficiencies.

COURSES MEETING UNIT DEFICIENCIES

The enclosed chart provides a concise listing of the courses which, when completed, will remove the unit deficiencies. Below college level courses, while counted in credits earned, do not count toward graduation in any way.
