January 30	Can You See It? Using the Zaltman Metaphor Elicitation Technique
Tuesday   11:00 – 12:00PM	(ZMET) in Teaching and Learning – Jennifer Adler
433 Sherrod	Pictures are not just worth a thousand words – they can also unlock powerful insights into cognitive and metaphorical connections. This session will introduce the Zaltman Metaphor Elicitation Technique (ZMET), a research tool designed to elucidate how people understand (or "frame") a topic by analyzing visual images. ZMET can help teachers and students apprehend biases that influence how we experience and understand the world. In ZMET, investigators ask participants to collect pictures representing their thoughts and feelings about a topic and then interview them about their image sets. This session will showcase diverse uses of ZMET and how its principles can be adapted to the classroom. Participants will also engage in a modified ZMET exercise to experience this powerful technique firsthand and leave with practical and creative strategies for implementing ZMET. Join us to explore the power and possibilities of ZMET-informed practices in the classroom.
