


ETSU FOUNDATION BALANCE

Major Gifts

- Following the retirement of Pamela Ritter, John King has been named Interim Vice President for University Advancement and President/CEO of the ETSU Foundation.
- Interim leadership for the Major Gifts division is being provided by Rebecca Muncy, Executive Director of Planned Giving, who is also serving as Interim Associate Vice President for University Advancement.
- Tyler Gaby has been named Director of Development for the College of Public Health.

Annual Giving

- The Annual Giving team distributed a mass mailer to support Hurricane Helene relief efforts through the Bucs Rebuild Together Campaign focusing on the Student Crisis Fund, Food Pantry, and Employee Assistance fund. More than \$100,000 to date has been raised.
- The president's tailgate events and alumni awards ceremony provided a setting for a soft launch for the Student Foundation Ambassadors program, a partnership with the Alumni Association. The purpose of this organization is to enhance student engagement and philanthropic initiatives on and off campus.
- Annual Giving is rebranding Day of Giving to Forever ETSU: Week of Giving, expanding the opportunity to make an impact. The week kicks off Monday, April 21 with Faculty/Staff Giving Day, followed by Tuesday (4/22), the start of giving for all supporters. 4/23 Day on Wednesday celebrates donor stewardship and gratitude while Thursday highlights student philanthropy and graduate celebrations. This leads to a campus-wide donor appreciation movie night on Friday.

Planned Giving

- Staff continues to work with donors on creating their legacies through planned giving.
- Targeted communications were sent through the FreeWill platform.
- The Executive Director recently traveled to Florida to meet with donors.

Advancement Services

- Advancement Services completed the Voluntary Support for Education Survey and Alumni Engagement Metrics Survey (both national benchmarking tools).
- New and advancing DPT members have been identified for the February 21 DPT event.
- The team continued to refine business processes and settings in our new CRM system.

Donor Relations


- The 2023-24 Endowment Reports were distributed; this year, these reports moved to an on-demand digital format.

- A new process for stewarding first-time donors is being implemented.

Alumni Association

- During ETSU Founders Week, the Alumni office helped launch the inaugural Founders Week Service Project "Bucs Stuff the Bus" that was expanded to include support for schools impacted by Hurricane Helene.
- Recent events include Top Golf in Knoxville, an alumni reception with Coach Savage in Jacksonville and the inaugural Alumni Arctic Adventures series of events throughout the winter.

College of Nursing

After a national search, ETSU has welcomed Dena Evans, Ed.D., MPH, MSN, RN, CNL, CNE as Dean of the College of Nursing. Dr. Evans previously served as vice dean of Faculty and Academic Affairs at the University of South Florida College of Nursing, and is a native of North Carolina.



 ETSU has also selected Dr. Jennifer Hitt to serve as the new Executive Director of the Tennessee Center for Nursing Advancement. Dr. Hitt previously served as nursing program director and chair of Health Sciences at Christian Brothers University in Memphis, and is president-elect of the Tennessee Nurses Association. The center's vision is to become the premier hub for advancing nursing science, empowering nurses and nursing students, and nurturing healthy communities throughout our region and Tennessee. ETSU is committed to leading the way in nursing education, research, and community health initiatives.

Gatton College of Pharmacy

- The Gatton College Class of 2023 achieved a 96.5% first attempt pass rate on their NAPLEX exam scores, placing the college at No. 2 in the country and No. 1 in Tennessee and the Southeast.
- The Class of 2024 received national attention on Match Day. Their Postgraduate Year One (PGY-1) match rate of 92% ranked No. 6 in the nation and No. 1 in Tennessee and the Southeast.
