CHECK WITH NURSING ADVISOR TO MAKE SURE ALL INTENSIVE REQUIREMENTS ARE MET.

ETSU COLLEGE OF NURSING ADMISSION CRITERIA:

1. Apply and be fully admitted to the university for the intended term of entry. If you have been accepted at ETSU previously, complete and submit the Re-admit Form to the university. Refer to the Application Process below.
2. Minimum cumulative grade point average of a 2.60 on a 4.0 scale (on all college level course work). Developmental studies grades/quality points will not be used in the calculation for the cumulative GPA for admission purposes.
3. Completed or have in progress the following Math/Science courses (or equivalents):
 1. HSCI 2010/2011 Anatomy & Physiology I w/lab
 2. HSCI 2020/2021 Anatomy & Physiology II w/lab
 3. HSCI 2230/2231 Intro to Microbiology w/lab
 4. MATH 1530 Probability and Statistics
4. Earned a minimum of a “C” (2.0) in each of the required Natural Science courses and Math 1530 course:
 1. Only 2 of the HSCI and MATH 1530 courses may be repeated to achieve a “C” (2.0)
5. Graduate from an accredited registered nurse diploma or associate degree program, hospital diploma graduates and graduates of non-accredited associate degree programs must also present a minimum of 35 semester hours of college credits. Coursework must include: English composition – 6 semester credits; Natural Science – 8 semester credits; Social/Behavioral sciences – 6 semester credits; General education/electives – 9 semester credits. Credit may be earned by taking the courses from a regionally, accredited institutions.
6. Unencumbered RN Licensure or eligibility for licensure in the state of TN or a compact state.

Transfer of Nursing College credits: All nursing courses, in which a grade of “C” (2.0) or higher was earned, will be transferred in as nursing electives. Nursing courses, in which a grade of “C-“ or less was earned, are considered nursing failures. Please contact the College of Nursing Office of Student Services regarding the nursing failure policies and procedures.

The RN to BSN Academic Advisor can help you determine any general education courses needed for the degree. These courses can be taken online through ETSU while in the nursing program. General education courses can be determined through individual program planning per orientation. Graduates of ETSU must complete their last semester of courses through ETSU.

Students should consult the Undergraduate Catalog for specific requirements for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

ETSU requires all students to have 50 credit hours from a senior-level (4 year) college or institution which includes transfer courses from a senior level institution. The RN/BSN major requires completion of 32 semester credits which will partially fulfill the university requirement of 50 semester credits. Therefore, an additional 18 semester credits must be completed at a senior-level college or university, ETSU or any other 4 year institution. Refer to Articulation Agreement Credits for eligibility of additional credit given for senior institution credit/BSN degree.
