
Tennessee Drought Update

This Week's Drought Monitor of Tennessee Map



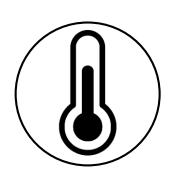
