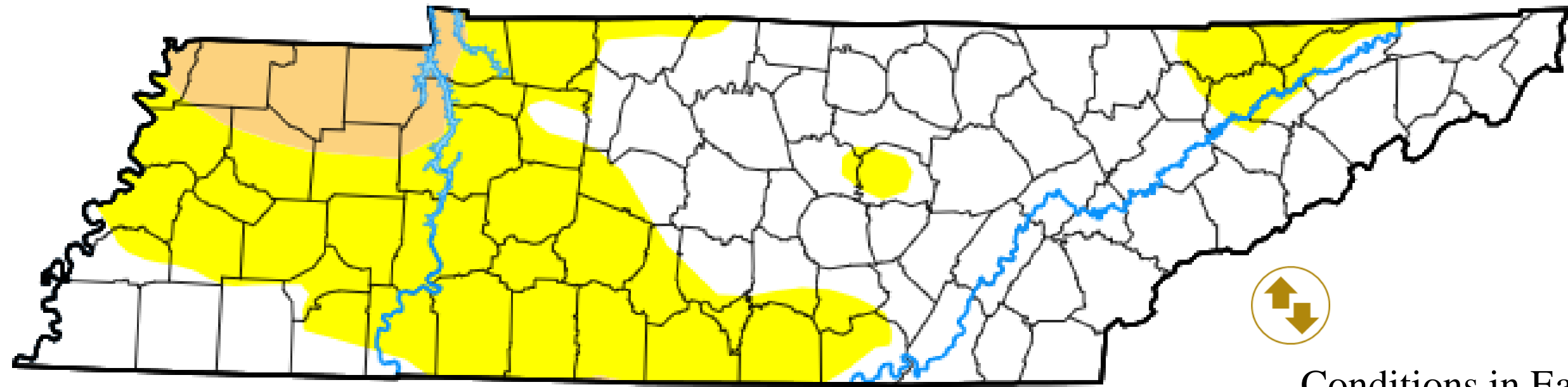


Tennessee Drought Update

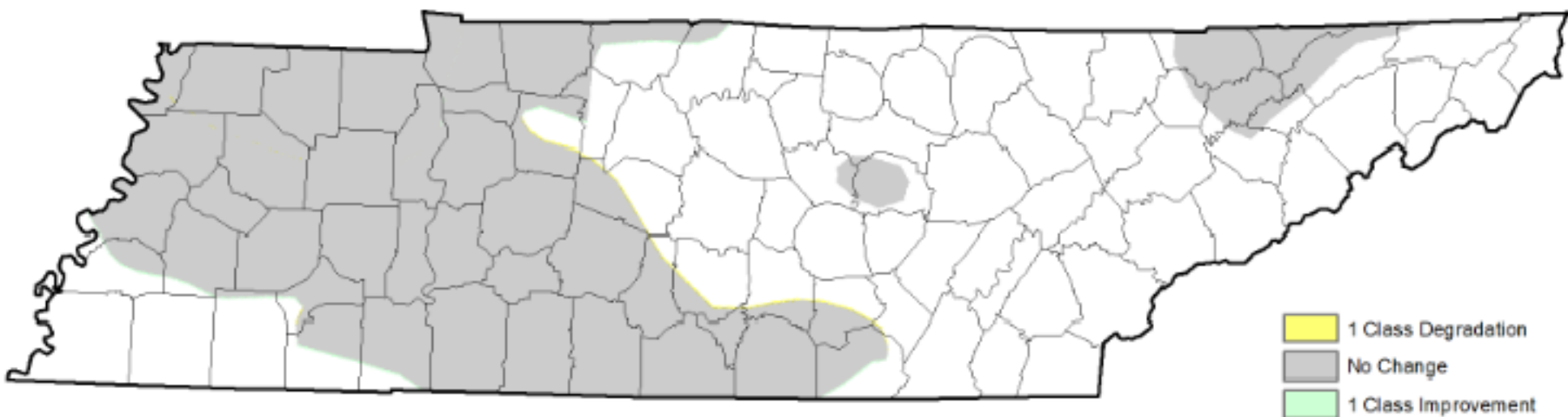


Conditions in West and Middle Tennessee remain steady for this week's drought monitoring period (Tuesday to Tuesday).

Statewide Condition Summary

What's Changed? With rain amounts and temperature remaining steady across the state over the last drought monitoring period (Tuesday to Tuesday), conditions have remained the same.

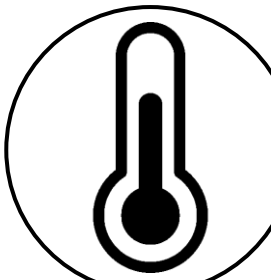

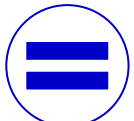
