If a student has already taken one of the required courses in the HID curriculum, an honors-enhanced course may substitute for that course. An honors-enhanced course is a 3000/4000-level course in the Digital Media department that includes enrichment experiences in addition to the regular course requirements. A form for creating an honors-enhanced section of a course (“Course Enhancement Agreement”) is found on the College’s HID website. The completed form must be submitted to their departmental coordinator within the first two	

weeks of the semester. The student should work with their departmental HID coordinator to find an honors-enhanced course.

Honors-enhanced courses may be used to satisfy no more than two courses (i.e., six - eight credits) of the required hours (upon approval of their departmental HID coordinator). No course enhancements may be substituted for the student's Honors Foundations of Research or Honors Thesis courses.
