Candidates for the Initial Licensure Concentration must achieve a minimum test score on the GRE: 151 on Verbal Reasoning and 153 on Quantitative Reasoning.

You may request a waiver of the GRE requirement to the Graduate Coordinator and the School of Graduate Studies if you meet or exceed minimum score requirements on one of the following state mandated tests:

- ACT: 22 composite score, ACT 21 composite score will be considered; OR
- SAT: Reading 543 and Math 533; SAT combined score of 1020 will be considered; OR
- PRAXIS CORE: Reading 168 and Math, 162; PRAXIS CORE Reading 156 and Math 150 will be considered.

AND

Graduate students seeking PreK-3 licensure must be admitted to the Teacher Education program. They must file a Declaration of Intent with the college's Office of Student Services, be recommended by an Admissions Board, and complete all other requirements for admission to teacher education including submission of a criminal background check. Finally, all graduate students must complete all state-required PRAXIS Subject Assessments priort to admission to Residency 1 in Semester 4.
