

School Librarianship: Completer Effectiveness

2024-2025

The School Librarianship Program had 3 initial licensure graduates (M.Ed. in School Librarianship) in the 2024-2025 academic school year. Fourteen individuals who completed the program in varying years responded to a TEAM score survey request, and all fourteen reported scores provided on their individual Tennessee TEAM evaluative instrument (completed by school principals). The Tennessee TEAM Library Specialist rubric considers such criteria as library management, collaboration, resource sharing, and instructional integration. The scale of the evaluative rubric runs from one to five, one being significantly below expectations, five being significantly above expectations. For ETSU's School Librarianship graduates surveyed in 24-25, five completers scored a 5 (Significantly Above Expectations), one scored a 4.8 (Significantly Above Expectations), one scored a 4.67 (Significantly Above Expectations), one scored a 4.5 (Significantly Above Expectations), one scored a 4.4 (Significantly Above Expectations), one scored a 4.43 (Significantly Above Expectations), three scored a 4 (Above Expectations), and one scored a 3.00 (at expectations).
