The Student-Faculty Collaborative Grants (SFCGs) are designed to support the original research/scholarly activities of undergraduate students being mentored by a faculty member.

The Honors College and the Office of Research & Sponsored Programs are pleased to provide awards to support undergraduate research and creative activities.

In return awardees are asked to provide a brief report at the end of the award cycle. Information in these reports may be shared with university donors who support these programs.

Please include:

- Student name and department
- Faculty mentor name and department
- Title of the scholarly/research activity
- Period of time in which the activity took place
- *Optional:* Photos or other images/multimedia that can be used to promote/share this research activity with the ETSU community

The report should include a description of:

- Whether or not the project goals as outlined in the proposal were met
- The results/findings/outcomes of the scholarly activity/research study (answer to the research questions)
- Practical application of the completed activity (written for an audience outside of your field)
- Next steps and/or ongoing work
- Planned or completed presentations, publications or other methods for sharing the results
- How this experience has impacted your education and career goals

Finally, please remember to credit the Honors College and the Office of Research and Sponsored Programs where appropriate in presentations or manuscripts.

Please submit the report as Word document or PDF attachment via email to the Director.
