EAST TENNESSEE STATE UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF NURSING Admissions Criteria for Non-Nurses

Application Deadlines Summer: February 1 Fall: June 1 Spring: October 1

1. Students must be in progress or have completed all ETSU General Education courses* (or equivalent from a Transfer Institution) including the 4 Nursing Pre-requisite classes: Anatomy and Physiology I and II (with labs), Intro to Microbiology (with lab), and Probability and Statistics. At least 3 of the 4 pre-requisite math/science classes must be completed prior to the application deadline.

Students with greater than 2 unsuccessful attempts to complete all required pre-requisite math/science courses will be ineligible for admission to the College of Nursing. Grades below a "C" (C-, D+, D, and F) are considered unsuccessful attempts.

*Transfer students are responsible for making sure courses taken at other institutions are equivalent to ETSU General Education courses. For further information about transfer equivalency, go to https://www.etsu.edu/articulation/equivalencies.php/

Students who have already earned an AA/AS or any bachelor's degree will have completed all of the general education requirements.

2. GPA requirements: 3.0 overall gpa and 2.6 in nursing pre-reqs.

- 3. Students must apply to the College of Nursing using the Centralized Application System (Nursing CAS). Official Transcripts from all colleges attended (including dual enrollment during high school) must be sent to CAS. Transfer students must also apply for General Admission to ETSU as a Health Professions Nursing Interest (HPNU) applicant. This should be done well in advance of the application deadline and more information can be found on the ETSU Admission's website (https://www.etsu.edu/admissions/).
- 4. Applicants must submit (electronically) all scores from the TEAS standardized entrance exam. Scores are valid for two years. The TEAS exam is given on the ETSU campus for our applicants on a regular basis. Information about scheduling and preparing for the TEAS can be found at <u>www.atitesting.com</u>
- 5. ETSU College of Nursing does NOT require references, a personal statement or professional experience for admission.
- 6. Please contact us if you've previously attending a nursing program, but didn't graduate.
- 7. Applicants are ranked by a point system which includes 400 possible points in 3 areas: Overall GPA (100 points), Math/Science Nursing Pre-requisite GPA (200 points), overall TEAS score (100 points). Applicants are admitted in point order.
- 8. First Time Freshmen admitted to ETSU with a high school GPA of 3.5 or above and an ACT composite score of 29 or above (or an SAT math/critical reasoning composite score of 1350 or above), and who maintain an ETSU overall GPA of 3.2 or above, will be guaranteed admission to the BSN program. Students must complete the College of Nursing application process and meet all other established admission criteria including the TEAS exam.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the application deadline for the BSN (Bachelor of Science in Nursing) program?

October 1 for programs beginning spring semester; February 1 for programs beginning summer semester, and June 1 for programs beginning fall semester. The application will be available online 45 days prior to each deadline.

- 2. How many students apply to the program and how many do you accept? We generally receive between approximately 200-300 applications. We accept approximately 150-180 students combined to all locations. Space in program is determined before acceptances are made.
- **3.** Do you keep a waiting list? Yes. Qualified students remain on the list, and we will admit additional students in point order as space becomes available until classes actually begin.
- **4. What are the minimum gpa requirements?** Students are required to have a 3.0 overall and at least a 2.6 in the four pre-requisite courses.
- **5.** Do you offer a two year (Associate Nursing Degree) or LPN license training? No. The BSN is a 4-year degree. There are several Community Colleges in the area which offer a two-year degree or TCATs which offer an LPN program.
- 6. Can I Minor in Nursing? No.
- 7. I've decided to pursue nursing, but I am not a Health Professions-Nursing Interest (HPNU) student. How do I change my major?

Make an appointment with an HPNU advisor by calling 423 439-4578. Tell the Executive Aid it is a "change of major" appointment or stop by our office.

8. I want to transfer to ETSU and apply to the nursing program. Where do I send my transcripts?

The process requires two applications—one to ETSU Undergraduate Admissions and one to the College of Nursing through the Nursing Centralized Application Service (CAS). Send transcripts to CAS. We suggest contacting an advisor to determine if you are ready and eligible to apply to our program. 9. Do courses taken a long time ago still count?

General education courses, electives and pre-requisites do not "expire". However, you are responsible for knowing the material in pre-requisite classes.

10. Where do I sign up for the TEAS test?

Create an account at the ATI Testing site: <u>www.atitesting.com</u>. We administer the TEAS at ETSU, through our Testing Center: <u>https://www.etsu.edu/uged/cfaa/testing/</u>. You do not have to be an ETSU student to take it on our campus. If you do not live in the area, you can take it at other locations found on the ATI testing website.

11. When should I take the TEAS test?

We need the scores by the application deadline, so on or before October 1, February 1, or June 1^{st} .

The test is given at ETSU throughout the year. If you do not take the TEAS at the ETSU testing center, you will be responsible for sending your results to ETSU. The results of the test are electronic and immediate, so you can see your scores after completing the test.

12. Can I study for the TEAS?

Yes. We strongly suggest that you prepare for the test. Study materials are available to purchase on the ATI website. Practice tests and a study manual are both recommended. TEAS prep books are also available on Amazon and local bookstores. There are 4 sections to the TEAS exam: Math, Reading, Science, and English.

13. Can I take the TEAS more than once?

You can take the TEAS two times per application cycle, but only once per semester. We will take the highest scores, even if they are from different tests. This is referred to as "super scoring."

14. How long are the TEAS scores valid?

Two years

15. How long does it take to earn the BSN degree?

The nursing courses take five semesters to complete. If you apply and are accepted at the beginning of your sophomore year (3rd semester in college), then you can complete the degree in four years. It does take some students longer, depending on circumstances. Accelerated programs go year-round, and therefore, are completed in 18 to 20 months.

16. If I apply and do not get accepted, can I apply again the next semester? Yes, you can apply again. We do suggest that you make an appointment with an HPNU nursing advisor to discuss your options.

17. How much does it cost to attend ETSU?

ETSU charges per credit hour, so each semester will cost a different amount. There are also course fees, books and supplies that add to the cost. 18. Do you offer online classes for this program?

The Traditional/Accelerated BSN is not an online program. General education courses are offered online.
