50 University Hour Requirement: The University requires that all graduates complete 50 hours from a senior-level college or institution. The RN/BSN major requires completion of 32 semester credits; these 32 credits will partially fulfill the university requirement of 50 semester credits. Therefore, an additional 18 semester credits must be completed at a senior-level college or university, ETSU or any other 4 year institution. Graduates of schools holding articulation agreements with ETSU are eligible for an additional 8-12 hours of credit through assessment for successful completion of the first full-time semester of the program. Diploma graduates are also eligible for 42 hours of credit through assessment. Please contact your advisor for a list of institutions holding current Transfer Articulation Agreements and credit through assessment for diploma student. **Graduates of ETSU must complete their last semester of course(s) through ETSU.**

Note: 12+ Credit hours is full-time at the university level at ETSU.
