VUB Summer Semester Information and Instructions

Page three of the newsletter contains the Veterans Upward Bound (VUB) 2018 Summer Semester schedule of classes. It is very similar to previous semesters and it contains all the precollege class opportunities for most veterans to prepare for success and entrance into a post-secondary program.

We will continue our basic math and English classes by offering tutoring for those who need to brush up on their

basic skills. Please call the VUB office to arrange this individual service. We will continue to provide tutoring for those who need additional preparation before taking the college assessment and placement exam.

Please note that computer skills class meets twice per week, while the remainder (science and statistics) meets only once per week. Also note that the semester is nine weeks

in length.

We have designed the schedule so you will be able to register for up to four different classes during a four-day period without class conflicts.

Congratulations to Ms. Morgan Ketner for being selected as a recipient of the 2016-17 VUB Polly Archer Award in the amount of \$250. This award was established in 1996 to recognize the most outstanding VUB college student with the best academic year performance.

Morgan's 2016-17 academic year included completing two ETSU undergraduate semesters with a total of 26 credit hours and a GPA of 4.0, selected for the Dean's List both semesters, and completing 12 credit hours of graduate work with a 4.0

GPA in the ETSU Master of Social Work (MSW).

Morgan served nearly three years in the U.S. Army as a Water Treatment Specialist. She served over half of her active duty time in the War on Terrorism and was honorably discharged due to disablement circumstances.

In March 2016, Morgan contacted VUB for assistance in applying to the VA Vocational Rehabilitation (VAVR) Program to fund her education. She was approved by VAVR and enrolled summer 2016 and graduated in May 2017 with a BSW. Morgan enrolled in the MSW Program the following semester where she has earned a 3.957 GPA and will graduate May 5th.

Morgan has displayed the highest standard of conduct while participating in VUB and her ETSU social work classes. She has been a steady encouragement to her fellow students, by providing helpful academic advice and assistance. We salute you Morgan as being among VUB's best of the best!

My Money Five

Making the most of your money starts with five building blocks for managing and growing your money -- The MyMoney Five. Keep these five principles in mind as you make day-to-day decisions and plan your financial goals.

The Five Principles

EARN – Make the most of what you earn by understanding your pay and benefits.

SAVE & INVEST - It's never too early to start saving for future goals such as a house or retirement, even by saving small amounts.

PROTECT – Taking precautions about your financial situation, accumulate emergency savings, and have the right insurance.

SPEND – Be sure you are getting a good value, especially with big purchases, by shopping around and comparing prices and products.

BORROW – Borrowing money can enable some essential purchases and builds credit, but interest costs can be expenses. And, if you borrow too much, you will have a large debt to be repaid.
