BUC Fund Consent Calendar

- Short summary of what the organizations are asking for
 - Senator Bowman requests explanation for reduction/nonfunding
 - Buctainment did not fill out application very well
 - Counseling Center paying for GA's to learn new teaching methods
 - Dharma Community more specified for religion classes/department
 - Habitat for Humanity money will go to building house and buying materials, others felt that more than 300 students will volunteer through the project
 - Kappa Delta only put up \$250 did not discuss co sponsoring or fundraising attempts
 - Motion to accept: Senator Price
 - Second: Senator Neblett
- Period of debate
 - Motion: Senator NeblettSecond: Senator Baggett
- Dharma committee pulled by Senator Bowman
 - Explains event and that they don't have money except for seed money and slight membership fees
 - Chair Walden explains fees and when they break it down it's just down to BUC Fund paying for the Lama to come and teach class for 30 days.
 - Senator Roberts asks if he will be bringing a cultural viewpoint to the classes
 - Motion to fund for \$0: Price
 - Second: Bagget
 - Vote: 18-7-0
- Habitat for Humanity pulled by Senator Huffines
 - Same house as last semester
 - o No's were:
 - Senator Zaveri explains she wanted to allocate more money
 - Price no money because student organizations are not benefiting
 - Senator Minter was not aware it was a student organization on ETSU and feels that it is a worthy cause and should allocate more
 - Senator Collins proposed \$3,500 because they were working toward a \$35,000 goal combined with the \$10,000 from bucfund and is 10%
 - House is built within 1.5mi of campus banners say that ETSU students are working
 - Senator Neblett voted no because of same reasons as Senator Price

- President Hall says that he doesn't want to have B.U.C. Fund to be used as a crutch
- Senator Collins reiterates that it's an ETSU student organization
- Motion to fund \$3500: Senator Bowman
- Second: Senator Baggett
 - Vote: 25-0-0
- Kappa Delta pulled by Senator Neblett
 - They are providing \$250 for the event so the B.U.C. Fund is mentioning it as well. They are promoting at area high schools and charge a fee for them but free for ETSU.
 - Kappa Delta had not done fundraisers but FMLA had
 - Senator Rogers says that it's a campus wide event to get the name of KD out. She has seen this speaker.
 - Senator Price voted no because of fundraising and cosponserships because they had not planned far enough in ahead and had not thought about sponsorships
 - Senator Collins says that B.U.C. Fund is not a first option for fundraising, it's a last stop.
 - Committee based recommendation on presentation because of their lack of enthusiasm for fundraising
 - President Hall reminds that they're content neutral
 - Motion to fund \$1500: Senator Bowman
 - Second: Senator Zaveri
 - Debate
 - Motion to previous Question: Senator Bowman
 - Second: Senator Huffines
 - Vote: 14-10-0
