- 2. ERP implementation is still in process—should secure implementation partner soon
- 3. SACS—Dr. Hoff gave a presentation to University Council, 60-days out from the first submission date, SACS will do an on-campus visit on April 2023
- 4. New Vice Provost was hired, Dr. McCracken, for community engagement
- 5. Dr. Hoff—will present to the board a new set of peer institutions in August; institutions that have similar key indicators as ETSU

- 6. Exercise Medicine—presentation; TN ranks poorly with mental health, obesity, etc. program will launch in the Fall exercise medicine program; many folks on campus are involved in this implementation
- 7. HURON survey—93% participated, thank you to everyone who participated; anticipate that there will be some streamlining of various positions (i.e., having one central unit for marketing or student life, etc.); a review of the budget model will also be taken into consideration; as this moves forward, we will need to be comfortable with discomfort as things will change as this moves forward
- 8. Dr. Noland-spoke to him about remote policy, parental leave policy,
 - a. We need communication on these policies; draft policies need to be available; a draft for a remote policy was presented, but leadership sent it back for review as the policy was constrictive and we need more flexibility.
 - b. Enrollment is looking good, solid. We projected the budget to be down, ultimately, we think we will be flat; the next few orientations will be important for enrollment
 - c.Housing—is looking good, some students may need to be in hotels during the first few weeks of the semester
 - d. B.J. King will retire in January; no search committee has been formed at this time
- 9. Community Colleges are having a large decline in enrollment; the institution will strategize how we can help with this decline, particularly with our partners at Walter State and Northeast State
- 10. Renovations to Housing will begin in earnest summer of 2023
- 11. Governor has been in the news lately regarding the Hillsdale College comments regarding the value of higher education; Dr. Noland is upset considering he comes from a family of educators—he said we should turn the anger/frustration into action and discussing regarding the value/importance of higher education
