Dr. Dorman G. Stout was an icon of student life at ETSU and an alumnus, having graduated as a part of the class of 1952. Stout was the son of the longtime sociology professor for whom Roger-Stout Hall is named. He served as director of financial aid, assistant to the dean, dean of students, and then as vice president of student affairs until his retirement in 1996. He created this award to recognize outstanding student leadership. The award criteria denote that the student to be recognized will be active in leadership within organizations both on campus and within the community at large. The recipient will demonstrate the leadership traits and character of integrity represented by the life and service of Dr. Stout to East Tennessee State and to humankind.

The National Leadership Honor Society

Omicron Delta Kappa was the first college honor society of a national scope to give recognition and honor for meritorious leadership and service in extracurricular activities and to encourage development of general campus citizenship. ETSU Buccaneers selected for ODK join the ranks of over 300,000 women and men whose peers recognize them as scholars and leaders. They are truly students who leave a significant impact on their university. A total of 12 outstanding students will be inducted in 2024.

Morgan Blazer is an active student at ETSU with a passion for academic excellence and community engagement. She serves as a supplemental instruction leader and academic coach at ETSU, supporting her peers in their academic endeavors. Morgan has also contributed to university research as an undergraduate research assistant and coordinated a nutrition panel featuring local experts. Outside of academics, she has been involved in health education, serving as a health presenter at the VA Health Fair and an Alternative Break site leader. Morgan's leadership extends to coaching the Newport Cocke County Rapids Swim Team, serving as chief of staff for Student Government Association, and interning at organizations like Good Samaritan Ministries and A Step Ahead Foundation. Her diverse experiences demonstrate her commitment to making a positive impact both on campus and in the community

AQ Hanna is an accomplished student at ETSU, holding the titles of Bert C. Bach Fine & Performing Arts scholar and Mary V. Jordan Diversity scholar. She was selected to speak on a panel at a new student Preview event, sharing her experiences and insights with incoming students.

She has held key roles within the Student Government Association, including executive vice president, senator and associate justice. As a leader in Alpha Delta Pi, Brooke has served as president and vice president, earning awards such as Most Outstanding New Sorority Member in 2020, the Dorothy Shaw Leadership Award, and Chapter of the Year. Her advocacy skills are evident as a two-time student lobbyist, representing both Alpha Delta Pi and Greek Life. Brooke's leadership extends to Women in Political Science, where she served as vice president and she was selected for the evaluation of the political science program. As a pioneer ETSU Ambassador, she was among 25 selected for this elite program. Brooke's commitment to service includes volunteering at the Southern Appalachian Ronald McDonald House and serving as a Red Coat Ambassador for the Veterans Affairs Hospital. Her academic excellence is reflected in her consistent placement on the Dean's List, and she is a participant in the Honors College Changemakers Program. With her nomination for Most Outstanding Sorority Woman in 2023, Brooke's impact and leadership at ETSU are undeniable.

Finn Shirley is an engaged student at ETSU. He collaborated with the Changemaking director to create a "Changemaking Abroad" study abroad program and led efforts to compile a mental health resource database for students.
