

JOB TIP SPOTLIGHT: RESUMES FOR HIGH SCHOOLERS

- · Keep it to one page
- · List school activities, sports, or clubs as experience
- · Include volunteer work and community service
- \cdot Ask a teacher, counselor, or friend to review for typos and grammar.

Career Spotlight: Elementary School Teacher

- · Degree Needed: Bachelor's in Elementary Education
- · Education Path: Bachelor's degree program, typically 4 years (full-time) plus teaching license
- · Work Environment (examples): Schools, classrooms, after-school programs
- Some Things They Do: Teach reading, math, science, and more to children
 Median Salary: \$63,000



1: Choose a topic

- Choose a topic that isn't too broad.
 - Example: instead of writing about the Civil War, write about one battle



2: Organize your ideas



- Make an outline or diagram of ideas.
- Put main ideas in the order you want to present them and the supporting ideas under each main one.

3: Write the first draft

- Expand your ideas into paragraphs.
- Don't worry about making mistakes and just focus on getting your ideas down.



4: Revise



- Read the first draft aloud to see if it makes sense.
- make improvements and fix spelling and grammar errors.
- Ask someone to read your paper and give you feedback.

5: Write the final draft

- Reread your paper out loud one more time.
- Pay attention to the details this time and make final edits and revisions!
