# **VUB Spring Semester Information and Instructions**

Page three of the newsletter contains the VUB 2021 Spring Semester schedule of classes. As part of the national response to the coronaoutbreak, most virus ETSU employees are working now from home, but we're still ready to serve you. All pre-college our classes are now taught online using Comfit©, Khan Academy©, or our YouTube© channel but they still contain all the pre-college class opportunities for most veterans to prepare for entrance into and suc-

cess in a postsecondary program.

We will continue to offer Math and English tutoring for those who need to brush up on their basic skills.

We also provide tutoring using Comfit© online tutoring system for those who need additional preparation before taking the college assessment and placement exam.

Computer Skills class and other pre-college classes meet online once a week for the tenweek semester. We recommend participants register for at least two courses to receive the full benefit of instruction and be better prepared when you enter a postsecondary program.

# **ETSU Veterans Upward Bound Completes 40th Year**

On August 31, 2020, Veterans Upward Bound (VUB) Trio Project completed its 40<sup>th</sup> grant year milestone at ETSU. Veterans Upward Bound was created by an amendment to the original Economic Opportunity Act in 1972, to help returning Vietnam veterans in the transition from military life to postsecondary training in the school of their choice anywhere in the 50 states, DC and all territories.

In 1980, ETSU submitted a grant proposal to the U.S. Department of Education and was successful in being awarded the opportunity to have a VUB on campus starting September 1<sup>st</sup> of 1980. By the end of our 40th year, the VUB staff had served 3051 veterans and placed 1077 into postsecondary in 46 states and DC. Of those placed, there have been 335 first-time graduates and a total of 598 total graduations with 80 students currently enrolled.

As the VUB staff looks toward the future, we will continue to motivate and assist veterans in the development of academic and other requisite skills necessary for acceptance and success in a program of postsecondary education with the passion and diligence that has made the last 40 years successful.

# Fraud Avoidance for Veterans


Veterans and their benefits are the targets of many types of fraud, to include mail, telephone, and online fraud. VA is actively working to prevent these incidents, but you are the best line of defense against this criminal activity.

Here are some tips about being contacted regarding your Veterans Affairs (VA) benefits:

If you receive correspondence from VA concerning a claim, and you don't remember filing a claim, contact VA directly at 1-800-827-1000 to confirm details.



Be cautious of telephone numbers on your caller ID. Scammers can change the telephone number (spoofing) to make a call appear to come from a diffferent person or place.





When in doubt, hang up and call

VA directly at 1-800-827-1000, or call

If you receive an email or letter from

your Power of Attorney

representative (DAV, VFW, etc).

- VA will **never ask for your personal** information via email. This includes verification of your SSN, address, and/or bank information. VA only addresses personal information via mailed letters.
- VA may check in with you by phone, email, or text message. If you are unsure about any call, email, or text, confirm details with VA directly at
  - 1-800-827-1000.
- VA notifying you that your direct deposit information was updated, or that your eBenefits account information was updated, and you
  - don't remember doing so immediately contact VA at 1-800-827-1000. **Do not ignore the** email or letter. It could be your first sign that your information has been compromised.

VA does not threaten claimants with jail or lawsuits.
