



Over 40% of protocols reviewed by ETSU's Human Research Protection Program in fiscal year 2025 were conducted by student investigators.




ETSU received over **\$20 million** in federal awards in fiscal year **2025** and over **\$19 million** in state grants and contracts.



ETSU was ranked **239th** in the 2024 National Science Foundation Higher Education Research and Development Survey — a record high for the university.



ETSU had **\$50.6M** in research and development expenditures in FY24, a **263%** increase in the past five years.



ETSU is an **R2 RESEARCH UNIVERSITY** under the Carnegie Foundation classification.



ETSU had **\$64.8 million** in sponsored projects awarded for fiscal year 2025.

ETSU's Human Research Protection Program oversaw **767 research studies** during fiscal year 2025.



Nearly **80%** of sponsored projects awarded in fiscal year **2025** were service, training, or clinical service grants and contracts that directly serve the region and state of Tennessee.

presented research, scholarship, creative activity, and community engagement projects during ETSU's Research Day in April 2025.



ETSU has more than **300 student organizations** with more than 5,000 members.



Peterson is just the seventh Buccaneer ever to score more than **1,000 points** in **two seasons** with the program.



For the second straight season, the ETSU men's soccer team won the Southern Conference **REGULAR SEASON TITLE**.

Coach Allen Vital was named SoCon **COACH OF THE YEAR**, becoming the third ETSU coach in program history to receive the top honor.

ETSU alum **NATE ADKINS** played his second season with the Denver Broncos, catching three touchdown passes in 2024.



The men's golf team continues to be one of the most consistent programs in the country, winning its fifth consecutive **SOCON MEN'S GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP** last April.





