
Background

- The incidence rates of melanoma and nonmelanoma skin cancers are on the rise, particularly among adolescent and young adult women.
 - Melanoma is the most common cancer among women ages 25 to 29.
- Ultraviolet radiation from tanning beds has been epidemiologically linked to melanoma and non-melanoma skin cancers.

Background

In July 2014, the Surgeon General's Call to Action to Prevent Skin Cancer called upon partners in the education sector to increase awareness and prevention efforts.

Also, the FDA is proposing a rule to restrict tanning bed use to adults 18 and older.





Reasons to Consider a 100% Indoor Tan-Free Campus Policy


- The WHO has classified tanning beds as a human carcinogen.
- In 18-29-year-olds who had ever used a tanning bed, 76% of diagnosed melanomas were attributable to the tanning bed use.
- Indoor tanning is most prevalent among college-aged individuals, especially non-Hispanic white women.
- Universities may be held liable for tanning-related injuries.
- This policy parallels tobacco-free campus policies.
 - More cases of skin cancer attributable to indoor tanning than lung cancer cases attributable to smoking.

ETSU as an Inaugural Skin Smart Campus

- ETSU holds a prominent place in the field of skin cancer prevention research.
 - Over \$6 million in external funding
 - Improve likelihood of future funding, specifically an evaluation study of this policy's impact on skin cancer-related constructs
- National Publicity & Partnerships
 - National Council on Skin Cancer Prevention
 - MD Anderson Cancer Center
 - Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health

Policy Details

- Indoor tanning devices are prohibited on campus or in university buildings.
- ETSU will not promote off-campus housing that includes indoor tanning as an amenity by listing this type of housing on the <u>off-campus housing</u> <u>listings</u> webpage.
- 3. ETSU will not permit any off-campus merchant that sells indoor tanning services to be included as an <u>ID BUC\$ off-campus merchant</u>.
- 4. ETSU must provide <u>educational programming</u> focusing on <u>skin cancer prevention</u>.
