Response Rate

2012

- 593 (4.2%)
- 56.2% stated their health was very good or excellent (63.8% male; 53.8% female)
- 90.5% stated students surveyed their health as very good or excellent (93.3% male; 89.8% female)

2015


- 1504 (11.4%)
- \$\\$52.2\%\$ stated their health was very good or excellent (57.8\% male; 50.3\% female)
- \$\\$83.9\% stated their health as good, very good, or excellent (85.8\% male; 83.2\% female)

College students reported being diagnosed or treated by a professional with one or more of the above conditions within the last 12 months.




