HOW CAN I HELP MY CHILD?

- Read to your child on a regular basis
- Let your child see you read
- Praise your child for work, and display it for others to see
- Don't expect or demand perfection
- If you have criticisms or suggestions, make them in a positive and helpful way
- Teach your child to do things for him/herself rather than doing work for him or her
- ♦ Have a special place where your child can do homework
- Encourage your child's curiosity and interests
- Turn off the television more
- ♦ Go outside more
- Share your own experiences and goals with your child
- Read your child's messages from school
- Talk about what is happening at school with your child
- Enjoy your child as you grow and learn together

2ND GRADE HOMEWORK

Homework will be assigned nightly on most days Monday-Thursday. Homework is meant to practice the skills we are practicing in class. It should take your second grader around 20 minutes to complete homework. Your child will have a planner to write homework assignments inside. You can see what homework your child has each night by checking their daily planner. This is going to place more responsibility on your child. I will teach them how to use and record in their planners and you need to teach your child to be responsible, check their planners, and complete their homework each night. Some completed class work will typically be sent home in your child's folder on Fridays. Please keep in mind I keep a lot of student work for portfolio and student self-evaluation purposes. However, you will get your child's portfolio at the end of the school year. I like to focus on the process of learning and not the product. Many of our classroom activities involve "hands-on" learning. You should assist your child with their homework when needed, but please allow them to do the work

themselves. It is helpful for you to check for accuracy of your child's homework and help them with any misunderstandings. However, remember to allow them to make any corrections and please don't demand perfection. Students we do not turn in complete homework on time are typically required to complete it during their free time at school. This helps students build responsibility and accountability. Reading book bags will also be sent home regularly to promote reading at home. Please have your child come in the room daily and put away their belongings and allow them to turn in their folder and planner each day rather than doing it for them. I ask this so they can learn to build responsibility.

LUNCH & SNACK

Although the schedule has not yet come out for next school year we can currently assume second grade will be eating lunch at 10:25. We will have a break/snack time later in the day so if you think your child will have a hard time lasting until the 3:00 dismissal please feel free to send in an individual snack for them. Most second graders need this.

A bottle of water labeled with your child's name is also a good thing to have at school at all times. I suggest some sort of bpa free bottle that can be refilled and then taken home every few days to be washed. Water is the only drink that is allowed in the classroom with the exception of parties and other special occasions.

I do ask that if invitations are brought to school, that it is only for a party in which the entire class is invited to in order to spare hurt feelings.

SCHOOL HOURS 8:00-3:00

Drop Off:

Students may be dropped off at 7:30, but should wait in the cafeteria until the 7:50 bell. The classroom will open at 7:50. Students will not be allowed to enter before 7:50. Students who arrive after 8:00 will be considered tardy and should report to the office to be marked present for the day and receive a tardy slip.

Once your child is in the room, the job of putting their belongings away and beginning their day is up to them. Please allow your child this independence. Please quickly tell your child goodbye and help us to be ready to start our day promptly. Goodbyes and conversations after the 8:00 bell disrupt the flow of the start of your child's day.

Pick Up:

Dismissal is at 3:00 from the side door. Please only pick up your student early when absolutely necessary. We are busy until the last minute of our day. If you need to check your child out early please do so through the office. Students should be picked up by 3:15.

CAR LINE INFO

Car line pick up tag numbers will stay the same for next school year. Be sure and hang onto your tag from last year! If you are new to University School you will be assigned a car tag number for afternoon dismissal. Grades K-5 are dismissed from the side parking lot door beginning at 3:00. Here are some important points to keep is safe and efficient:

- Please use your car tag with your number on it at all times.
- ♦ Please don't arrive early for dismissal or block cars from leaving the parking lot.
- Please pull up as far as possible in the dismissal line and don't wave your child to come to your car before the adult loading sends them to your car.
- Try not to exit your car in the pickup line unless it is absolutely necessary.
- Please try to avoid in depth conversations with a teacher during dismissal.
- ♦ If you have an older sibling coming into the cafeteria to pick up a student in 2nd−5th grade please ask them to enter the cafeteria alone, quickly get their sibling, and exit the cafeteria without blocking the pathways.
- If you are walking up to pick up your child make sure the adult calling sees you and calls your child and then wait away from the doorway or loading area.
- If you have high school or middle school students you are picking up we recommend you aim for the later side of dismissal rather than the beginning.
- Be attentive to those around you and paitent in the car line.
- Students should be picked up by 3:15.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

I am including our class supply list so your child will be prepared when school begins. Please bring these in as soon as possible. Keep in mind that we share all of our classroom materials. I am asking for a minimal amount and may ask for donations at a later date if we run out of supplies.

If this list is a financial burden to your family please start with the individual supplies and work your way towards the shared supplies. If purchasing supplies is not something that is possible please contact me and I will work out an alternate way to make sure your child has what they need for second grade.

Because we have limited individualized storage, it is a good idea to send a backpack with your child daily. Your child's backpack will hang on a hook in the coatroom and it will serve as a storage place for personal items, lunches, library books, and take home messages. Students who do not carry backpacks often have a difficult time getting home with homework and other messages. I also have found that backpacks that do not have wheels and that are not too bulky work best in our limited space.

INDIVIDUAL SUPPLIES (LABEL WITH NAME):

- ◆ 1 white 1 1/2 inch 3-ring binder with a plastic cover for portfolio (label with name on inside— not on the outside— this will be the portfolio you receive at the end of the school year)
- 1 package of 30-40 clear plastic sheet protectors for your child's work in their portfolio (go ahead and take out of package and put inside the 3-ring binder)
- 1 set of head phones
 (preferably ear buds- must be able to plug into ipads- put in a plastic zip lock bag and label with name)
- 7 plastic folders with 3 prongs inside (label with name somewhere on inside)

SHARED SUPPLIES (DO NOT LABEL WITH NAME):

- 2-4 packages of washable markers
- 3 boxes of tissues (2 will be shared with our special area teachers)
- ♦ 2-4 glue sticks
- 50 or more plain yellow number 2 pencils (if at all possible already sharpened—this helps us tremendously)
- 3-5 rolls of scotch tape (the kind that can be used without a dispenser)
- 1 package of dry erase markers
- 1 container of Clorox wipes
- 1 roll of paper towels
