Book Challenge Project Guidelines 3rd 9 weeks: Below are the guidelines and directions for the projects.

Poetry Anthology Book project #13: Poetry Portfolio Project

Due Date: 01/19/2017

Student Directions: Students will create a poetry portfolio. It should include the following:

- 1. A Title Page with your name, date, book title, and a picture.
- 2. Include 4 samples of your own poetry. Include 4 pictures to represent your poems.
- 3. Include 4 poems you like from the poetry anthology you read. Include the title and author's name with each poem. Include 4 pictures to represent the poems.
- 4. Choose a poet to whom you would like to "dedicate" this portfolio. The page should be titled "Dedication." This should have a one paragraph biography about the poet, a picture of the poet, and one of their most famous poems (or your favorite).
- 5. Each poem can be typed or handwritten. Each poem should be on its own page in the portfolio.
- 6. Be creative in constructing your portfolio! Make it represent YOU!
- 7. USE RECYCLED MATERIALS- paper bags, string, boxes, tape, etc.

You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader's notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade.

Poetry Anthology Book project #14: Poetry Investigation w/poster

Due Date: 01/19/2017

Students will write out a poem of their choice from the collection of poems they read. The poster must be decorated to match the meaning of the poem. Students will also write a 4-6 sentence review of the poem. Some questions that should be answered in the review of the poem are: what is the author discussing in the poem, what is your favorite part of the poem and why, and why do you think the poet wrote this poem. The poster must include details from the poem, be creative, and can be a mini poster or a full size poster. You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader's notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade.

Science Fiction Book project #15: Movie Pitch Project

Due Date: 02/09/2017

Student Directions: Students will a movie pitch for their book. Imagine that you are the author of the book you have just read. Suddenly the book becomes a best seller. Write a letter to a movie producer trying to get that person interested in making your book into a movie. Explain why the story, characters, conflicts, etc., would make a good film. Suggest a filming location and the actors to play the various roles. You may only use books which have not already been made into movies. You need to write in complete sentences and use a business letter format for your letter. Your letter should be a minimum of 3 paragraphs.

You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader's notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade.

Science Fiction Book project #16: Comic Book Project

Due Date: 02/09/2017

Student Directions: Students will create a 6 page comic book. Each page must include 5-6 comic panels. You can create this by hand or use a comic book generator. The link is provided below and you can print the comic when its complete. If you are using the online comic generator you can select 6 panels and will have to complete 6 sets of them to create your 6 page comic book. Your content for your comic can be a summary of the book or a new ending to the novel. Each panel must be colored and include dialogue.

Fantasy Book project #17: Picture Book Project

Due Date: 03/02/2017

<u>Student Directions:</u> Students will create a picture book on their novel. You will rewrite the book for a Kindergarten or 1st grade audience. Make sure to use age appropriate words for your picture book. You need to include 15 pages in your picture book. Each page needs to be illustrated, include words, and colored. The front cover needs a title, name, and a colored illustration.

You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader's notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade. This project will be presented in class.

Adventure Book project #18: Book in a Bag Project

Due Date: 03/02/2017

<u>Student Directions:</u> Students will create a book in a bag. The outside of the bag needs to include: the book title, author, your name, a picture that is relevant to the book, and a 2-3 paragraph summary of the book. The inside of the bag needs to include: 10 items that represent people, places, and events in the book. Each item must have a card with a detailed description of each item and why it is important to the novel.

You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader's notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade. This project will be presented in class.
