

Book Challenge Project Guidelines 4th 9 weeks: Below are the guidelines and directions for the projects.

Mystery Book project #19: Wanted Character Poster Project

Due Date: 04/18/2017

Student Direction: Students will make a “wanted” posted for a character in the novel that could be “wanted” for crimes, failures, or mistakes. Research sample wanted posters for examples.

Information you must include on your poster are: the “crime,” physical description, a picture of the character, where the character was last seen, what to do if the character is found, what the reward would be if they are found. Additional information can be added if you would like. The poster must be colored.

You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader’s notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade.

Mystery Book project #20: Mystery Puzzle Project

Due Date: 04/18/2017

Student Directions: Mystery stories are written puzzles made for a reader. To complete this project, you will make a MYSTERY PUZZLE that gives information about the book you read. You will create different puzzle pieces. Details for each puzzle piece are below.

Piece #1 should be a creative display of the title and author of the book as well as your name.

Piece #2 should tell the reader about the main character and secondary characters in your book as well as include a picture of the main character.

Piece #3 should tell the reader about the setting of the book.

Piece #4 should tell the reader the problem of the book.

Piece #5 should tell the reader about the main events of the book.

Piece #6 should tell the reader about the climax of the book (the high point or turning point).

Piece #7 should tell the reader three clues about the problem of the book.

Piece #8 should give a hint of the solution of the problem but not give away the ending.

Put your pieces together on a large piece of paper, cardboard, or poster board.

You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader’s notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade.

Graphic Novel Book project #21: Diorama Project

Due Date: 05/04/2017

Student Directions: Students will create a 3-D diorama of an important scene from the book. You can use a shoebox or a small sized box to create your 3-D scene. You need to write a detailed description of your scene, what is happening in the scene, and why it is important to the story.

You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader’s notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade. This project will be presented in class.

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Graphic Novel Book project #22: Movie Poster

Due Date: 05/04/2016

Student Directions: Students will create a movie poster for the graphic novel they read. Movie posters are made to advertise the movie, so your poster should advertise the book. I encourage you to look online for examples. It will be presented in class.

Items that must be included on your movie poster:

1. Your poster must include book title, author, and your name
2. Your poster must contain pictures or original art to represent the theme of your novel. (Do not copy the book cover.)
3. You must have two quotes from the novel that tell something important about the novel.
4. List three "stars" (characters) of the book with pictures and a brief description. Tell us what actor/actress you would have playing the role of each character.
5. Two quotes from fictitious critics about the book.
6. You must have a short summary of the novel somewhere on the poster board.
7. Your poster must be colorful and creative.

You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader's notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade.

Reader's Choice Book project #23: Collage Project

Due Date: 05/18/2017

Student Directions: Students will create a collage to represent the book. The collage must include 15 pictures (they must be color, can be hand drawn, cut from magazines, or computer generated). The collage must include a key describing each item on the collage and its importance to the novel.

You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader's notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade.

Reader's Choice Book project #24: Bring a Character to School Project

Due Date: 05/18/2017

Student Directions: Students will select one of the characters in the novel and imagine what would happen if you brought her/him to your school for a day. You must write the questions and answer in complete sentences, using book details to support your answers. This may either be written from your point of view or from the character's point of view.

You should answer the following questions:

How would s/he fit it with the other students?

How might s/he react to the rules, teachers, assignments etc.?

How would s/he dress & how would people react to that?

What might s/he find interesting?

What might s/he find challenging?

What is a piece of advice you would give the character to help them at school?

You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader's notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade.
