

Book Challenge Project Guidelines 1st 9 weeks: Below are the guidelines and directions for the projects.

Historical Fiction Book project #1: Historical Letter

Due Date: 07/28/2016

Student Directions: Students will write a historical letter from the point of view of one of the characters in the novel. The letter needs to include 3 accurate historical facts in the body of the letter, and include inferred details by using your own knowledge/thoughts about the events in the novel. Your letter needs to be written in proper friendly letter format, include an accurate date, greeting, 3 body paragraphs, and a closing. You also need to make your letter look accurate to the time period you are writing from.

You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader's notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade.

Historical Fiction Book project #2: Character Journal

Due Date: 07/28/2016

Student Directions: Students will create a journal from the subjects point of view. The journal must include 3 journal entries for the main subject of the book. The journal entries can be handwritten or typed and must include: date current to the time, written in 1st person point of view, must include details from the characters life and details from the book, and each entry needs to be a minimum of 3 paragraphs. The journal needs to be made into a booklet and glued/taped into your reader's notebook. The front of the journal must include a title and a colored illustration.

You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader's notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade.

Historical Fiction Book project #3: Historical Newspaper

Due Date: 08/18/2016

Student Directions: Students will create a newspaper about the historical event from the novel. The format needs to follow the example on the right. You must include: a title for the newspaper, two main headlines with article titles (the articles must be a minimum of 3 paragraphs), a timeline of the historical event, a cartoon from a section in the book, and two illustrations or photographs. The paper can be typed or handwritten and must be colored.

You must also complete the book review organizer along with the project. The 2 items must be placed together in your reader's notebook, on 2 separate pieces of paper.

Pizza Slice Book Project



	Materials: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Large paper or cardboard circle (No smaller than 8 inch) cut into 6 equal slices.• Pencil• Chapter Book
Slice 1 – Characters <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Make a list of ALL the character in the book. Describe the main character.	Slice 2 – Setting <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Describe in detail one of the settings where the story takes place the most
Slice 3 – Problem <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Describe in detail one of the problems in the story. Use lots of detail.	Slice 4 – Solution <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Describe in detail how the problem was solved.
Slice 5 – Summary <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Describe in detail what the story was about. Make sure to include only important details.	Slice 6 – Title/Author <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Write the title and author of the story. Make sure to spell all the words correctly.
Overall: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• You have complete sentences.• You have your neatest writing.• Good presentation.	

Realistic Fiction Book project #5: Character Letter

Due Date: 09/08/2016

Student Directions: Students will write a letter from the main character's eyes (point of view). You will pretend that you are the main character in this novel. You will write a letter to another character in the book. Your letter must explain 4 different events that happened in the story using specific details from the story and your inferencing knowledge to write about the events. Your letter needs to be written in proper friendly letter format, include an accurate date, greeting, 4 body paragraphs, and a closing.

You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade.

Realistic Fiction Book project #6: Character Scrapbook

Due Date: 09/08/2016

Student Directions: Students will create a scrapbook about the main character in the story. The scrapbook must include 6 pages. The pages must be completed in the following order:

Page 1: cover page (include the colored illustration, a title and author),

Page 2: main character page, this page must include 5 details about the character and include character traits.

Page 3: settings pages with details about why the setting is important to the story.

Page 4: character's problem page. This page needs to include specific details about the problem the character is facing in the story.

Page 5: character's solution to the problem. This page needs to include specific details on how the character solved the problem.

Page 6: character prediction page. For this page you will use details from the story to predict the characters future. What do you think will happen to the character in the next year or so?

Your scrapbook needs to be creative, in color, each page needs to include a pictures that relates to the page, and it can be typed or handwritten. All information needs to be written in complete sentences. You must follow the directions for labeling each page in your notebook and how projects should be placed in your notebook to earn full credit for this area of the grade.
