Summary:

This event is for regional high school students who are interested in or want to learn more about the health sciences and programs available at East Tennessee State University.

After a guest lecture by a clinical faculty member, you will divide into small groups and work with peers on medical scenarios pertaining to a "Theme of the Night," to be announced on the day of the event. Though this, you will learn how different types of medical practitioners think about the same problem in different ways and work as a team to benefit the patient and the community. Small group cases are organized by medical, pharmacy, nursing, public health, and physical therapy students to encompass what they do in their studies and in their fields. This provides a very college-like atmosphere in which you will be expected to work in teams. No prior health or medical knowledge is necessary!

After the small group activities, you will have the opportunity to ask questions of professional students in the Colleges of Medicine, Pharmacy, Nursing, Clinical and Rehabilitative Sciences, and Public Health in a panel session.

Food, a t-shirt, information packets about ETSU's many health careers programs, and a certificate of completion of this program will be provided to each participating student.

Who Can Apply?

Any regional high school student—including but not limited to those from East Tennessee, Western North Carolina, and Southeastern Virginia—is encouraged to apply. Students in the 12th, 11th, and 10th grades will be given preference of seats, in that order. Any remaining spots will be filled by 9th graders.

Participants will be selected based on this application by the first year medical students of the Quillen High School Outreach Program.
